Norwich Charities

Anguish's Educational Foundation

Bartholomew Balderston's Foundation

Eligibility: Under 18, resident within City of Norwich boundary, have attended school for at least two years within City of Norwich.

Norwich Consolidated Charities

Eligibility: Permanent resident of the City of Norwich, no age limit.

Types of Grants: Basic household items, baby items, childcare costs, homeopathic treatment, specialised medical equipment. One-off grants for persons leaving umbrella housing to set up on their own. Welfare assistance for parents.

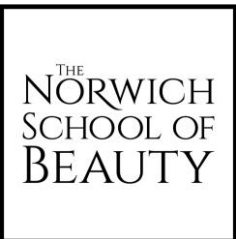

National Charities

Family Action / Horizons Education Fund

Eligibility: Low income families / lone parent.

The Women's Careers Foundation

Foundation East

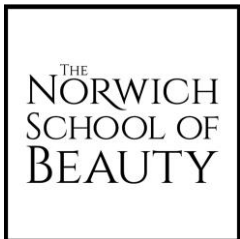
Eligibility: You have to be a small business or social enterprise with a workable business plan, but can't get a bank loan or need additional funds to match a bank loan. Your business is based in Norfolk, Suffolk, Cambridgeshire or Essex.

Types of Loans: Enterprise loans ranging from £3,000 to £50,000; terms from six months to ten years; interest rates vary, but usually in the range of 12-15%. Other fees may apply.
